Landscape implementation may be done all at once or during a set number of years, depending on your budget limitations and the scope of your project.

Experience & Reputation

Keep in mind that you should determine the reputation and experience of a prospective landscape architect or designer well before you enter this process. Money saved in the short term may not be considered well spent in the long run.

Maintenance

One of the most important things you need to share with your designer or landscape architect is the amount of time you want to spend on maintenance.
